## When Fido Flees

An owners "worst nightmare" is one when their pet is found missing. I can still remember the sinking feeling I had almost 8 years ago when I came home to find the gate open and Chase, along with his visiting brother Ready, were nowhere to be found. After numerous phone calls and some very fast heart rates, there was a plan in place. But no one is thinking rationally when they discover their dog is lost so here is a list of actions to take to help expedite a speedy return to home.

Act immediately. Don't assume that you will walk down the street and find your dog. Round up as many helpers as possible and as quickly as possible. Notify dog wardens, police and local veterinarians in the immediate area where the dog was lost as well as the surrounding towns. Give a description of the dog (not just the breed as many don't know what a BMD is) including color and weight, call name, tag numbers and any other identifying information that is pertinent. Try not to be too descriptive as most police will not take a lot of information over the phone. Give at least two names and phone numbers of contact people should they locate the dog. Keep checking with these officials two or three times a day as shifts change and information is often not passed on.

As soon as the dog is known to be lost, search by foot a radius from where the dog was lost as far as you can physically cover. Knock on doors, look under decks and autos, search open garages and investigate any area in which a dog might hide or find comforting. Most dogs become scared when lost and might not come to their name being called even though they might recognize the voice.

PRINT FLYERS (ideally assign this task to someone who might not be as productive out physically searching like a doggie grandma who wants to help). Keep a file on hand at home with a reproducible photo of the dog as well as identifying information. Flyers should include: A copy of a clear photo of the dog, a brief description of the dog (large, black, rust and white with red collar) as well as the approximate weight for a size reference, what name they will answer to, two numbers that someone can call day or night. If you are offering a reward list this but not the amount. Pass out the flyers give them to anyone

who will take one. This is the cheapest and quickest way to get the word out to the public. Put them at all street corners, in storefronts, hand them to people riding bikes, walking, jogging, getting their mail, etc. Assign someone to knock on each door in the neighborhood and give out a flyer. If no one answers the door, leave a flyer in the mailbox or at the door. When going door to door, carry a color photo of the dog to make the neighbors familiar with what the dog looks like.

Change the message on voicemails to let callers know they have reached the correct number, additional ways to contact you or information you need from them to return the call.

Organize a search once it is determined that the dog has not been immediately found. Mobilize searchers and assign to the areas to be searched. This will eliminate the possibility of missing certain areas and spending too much time in the same areas. With today's computer accessibility, it is easy to print a map of the area in which you are searching so that everyone knows where they need to be.

Establish a home base of operation. Ideally the base is where the dog was lost from as many times a dog will be found very close to where it was lost. There should be someone available at the base at all times for searchers to check in as well as to receive potential sighting calls. The phone number at the base should be the first number listed on the flyers.

Send someone who your pet knows on a "tour" of all local animal shelters. Most will not give information over the phone but require that someone come in person to look at dogs that have been recently brought in to the shelter as well as to file a report on a missing animal. Assure all searchers have cell phones and have a master list of numbers given to all searchers so they can contact each other if they have a sighting of your dog or if they need to call the home base to check in. Also, should someone contact home base about a sighting, the nearest available searcher can be contacted to respond to this sighting.

Have something familiar available for the dog to come back to if he was lost from his own home. Leave a gate open to the yard, a door open to the house or car open so that if he finds his way back home he will have a safe place to go to. If he is lost in a strange area, park a car that is familiar to him at the site where he was lost and leave it open for him to get into if he finds her way back.

If you know the dog has spent the night in a specific place, leave dirty underwear (that belongs to the owner!) at that spot in hopes that he might return and feel familiar with the smell. Have all searchers carry a piece of dirty clothing from the owner (ideally dirty underwear) so that if the dog is located it will smell a familiar smell and be more likely to come to the searcher.

If there are other dogs in the household, take them on the search as well., especially to areas where there has been a sighting. A frightened dog may come up to a canine friend when they have shied away from humans. Place lost dog notices in local papers, radio stations and TV stations. Some papers might do a human-interest story on what the dog means to you in hopes of getting someone to respond to the search.

### Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

July 23, 2006

The regular meeting of the BMDCR Board was called to order at 10:20 am on July 23, 2006.

#### Present:

Laura Haupenthal, Val Horney, Sara Karl, Sharon Keefer, Phil Shaffer, Lou Tucker, and Elaine Witulski.

#### Absent:

Gayle Brooks, Nadja Torling.

#### Approval of Minutes:

Phil moved to approve the minutes of the March meeting as published in the May/June 2006 newsletter. Sharon seconded the motion. Motion passed.

#### Approval of Minutes:

Sara moved to approve the minutes of the May meeting as published in the July/August 2006 newsletter. Laura seconded the motion. Motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report:** Sara reported that the club has positive balances in the checking, rescue, and savings accounts. Membership renewals are still being received and posted in the database for publication of the next membership directory.

#### Unfinished Business:

Proposal to require sponsorship for all membership levels:

Sara presented a membership application example in which requiring sponsorship for club membership at any level (e.g., for sustaining members, not just voting members) would be in the best interest of the breed. This requirement would involve a change in the BMDCR bylaws. It is possible the AKC may require other bylaw changes for finalization of BMDCR's AKC licensure. Thus the Board agreed to wait to consider the membership sponsors change as soon as any further changes required by AKC are received.

Newspaper Ad: As decided in the last meeting, and because Bernese Mountain Dogs continue to be listed for sale, Sara Karl did run the club ad again for one month in area newspapers.

#### New Business:

Donation to 2007 BMDCA National Specialty:

Val announced that BMDCR has received a request to submit a catalog advertisement and monetary contribution to the trophy fund for the 2007 National Specialty show. This will be voted on in the General Meeting.

Grand Valley Kennel Club show catalog BMD vignette:

Sharon presented a request received from GVKC to include a photo portrait and description of Bernese Mountain Dogs in the catalog for their show on September 24th and 25th, 2006. They are soliciting similar contribution from other breeds, too. Sara Karl moved that BMDCR submit a photograph, breed information, and the BMDCR logo and contact information, along with the \$40 fee to GVKC for educational inclusion in their show catalog. The motion was seconded by Elaine. Motion passed. Sharon will compile the submission and send it to GVKC by the August 1st deadline.

#### Fall Draft Test:

The Secretary for the October 14th Draft Test has been changed to Dottie Schulte. Possible locations were for the Breed Study Forum with AKC judges Mary Alice Eschweiler and Sara Karl that will be held following the Draft Test on October 15th.

### General Meeting Minutes

July 23, 2006

The regular meeting of the BMDCR membership was called to order at 11:28 am.

#### Present:

#### Approval of Minutes:

Phil Shaffer moved to approve the minutes of the March meeting as published in the May/June 2006 newsletter and the minutes of the May and meeting as published in the July/August 2006 newsletter. Dottie Schulte seconded the motion. Motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report:** Sara reported that the club has positive balances in the checking, rescue, and savings accounts.

#### Committee Reports:

A/AO Match:

Sara reported that this morning's A/AO match was a success and all entrants were present. Results will be published in the next newsletter, and proceedings will be submitted to AKC as required for BMDCR's AKC licensing process.

Regional Specialty:

Show Chairman Dottie Schulte announced that the Premium List was mailed out last week. Trophy and Raffle Donations are still needed. Contact Sara Karl to make a trophy donation. Contact Patti Morgan to make a raffle donation.

Rescue:

Patti Morgan reported that the club currently has 1 female, 2-year old Berner in Rescue. A possible placement is pending. Phil Shaffer reported that Amy B. who adopted a Berner from BMDCR Rescue last year has called and offered to host a future BMDCR event on her property near Loveland. BernerFiesta 2007 was discussed as a good event for her offer.

#### Unfinished Business:

Colorado Federation of Dog Clubs:

Information about the letter received from this organization was published in the April/May newsletter and read in this meeting by Val Horney. The fee for BMDCR to join this group

is \$75 and BMDCR would need to send a delegate to their annual meeting held in conjunction with the February shows in Denver. Following discussion, Dottie Schulte moved that BMDCR apply for one-year, \$75 membership to the Colorado Federation of Dog Clubs. Motion seconded by Sara Karl. Motion passed. Dottie Schulte volunteered to submit the application, to be the BMDCR delegate, and to report information from CFDC in our club newsletter.

Consider using alternative methods to locate your pet such as an animal communicator. Contact local Bernese owners to find someone who is reliable. If there is a local tracking club, contact them to check if they might have a dog who has skills with finding lost pets.

After your pet has been found, go back and take down flyers from utility poles and from businesses. This is common courtesy that many never follow up with. Notify the officials that the dog has been found otherwise you might get a call weeks or months down the road. Send thank you notes to the main searchers and coordinators.

Four years after the Chase/Ready scare, history repeated itself. I had moved to Greeley and Ready, who was visiting in a strange town, somehow found his way out of the yard. But experience helped and within thirty minutes neighbors and friends were mobilized and the animal shelter contacted. Within two hours he was back wet and stinky, but safe. Remember that dog people are there to help in times of need. Don't hesitate to put the word out that you need help searching. You'll be surprised at who comes forward even if it is in a small way.
